Marin Commutes is an initiative which helps commuters traveling to, from, and within Marin County save time, reduce stress, and minimize congestion and emissions. Here are five ways Marin Commutes makes commuting better.



### MARIN COMMUTES REWARDS

If you live or work in Marin, you can earn up to \$500 each year by using alternative transportation like transit, carpooling, walking, biking, and logging your trips. **Sign up at and get details at [marincommutes.org/rewards](https://marincommutes.org/rewards).**



### EMERGENCY RIDE HOME PROGRAM

Get reimbursed for up to four emergency trips home (up to \$125 per trip, \$500 each year) when unexpected situations arise. ### REDWOOD BIKESHARE

Redwood Bikeshare offers pedal-assist e-bikes located at hubs in Marin County and Sonoma County. ### CARPOOL MATCHING TOOL

### VANPOOL INCENTIVE

Vanpooling is like carpooling but typically includes seven or more commuters sharing a ride. If a driver or employer is interested in starting a vanpool, TAM offers up to \$3,600 in incentives (\$150 per month over two years) on top of Metropolitan Transportation Commission's additional financial incentives. **Learn more and start a vanpool at [marincommutes.org/vanpool](https://marincommutes.org/vanpool).**

The Transportation Authority of Marin (TAM) funds and manages transportation programs in Marin County. TAM administers the expenditure plans for Measure A, the ½ cent sales tax measure passed in 2004, renewed as Measure AA in 2018, and Measure B, the \$10 Vehicle Registration Fee passed in 2010, amended in 2023. Marin Commutes is TAM's comprehensive program to encourage alternatives to single occupancy driving while increasing awareness of commute options, incentives, and tools available to commuters.
